Welcome to Gadsden, Alabama

Gadsden is located on the beautiful Coosa River. It is located approximately 60 miles northeast of Birmingham, and 90 miles southwest of Chattanooga. Population is 103,931. Gadsden was the 2<sup>nd</sup> most popular city of industry, trailing Mobile. From the early 1900s thru the mid-1980s, Gadsden was a city of heavy industry and had a large steel plant named Republic Steele and was home to Goodyear Tire and Rubber Company. Gadsden was named an All -American City in 1991 by the National Civic League.

In May 1863 Confederate Brig. General Nathan Bedford Forrest was in pursuit of Union Colonel Abel Streight. Streight was ordered to cut off the Confederate Railroad near Chattanooga. He went to a small farmhouse owned by The Sansom Family and demanded coal to burn down the Black Creek Bridge to keep Forrest and his troops from crossing over the river. Forrest later stopped at that same farmhouse, and Emma Sansom led him to a low point in the Black Creek where he and his troops could safely cross in pursuit of Streight. A monument is dedicated at the North end of Broad Street in downtown Gadsden honoring Emma Sansom for her aide in helping the Confederate troops. Happy New Year District Four Altrusans! It excites me to look back over the last few months and reminisce upon some of the strides that we have made thus far as individuals, clubs and as a district. I've seen firsthand our membership take on and excel in leadership roles, our clubs grow and perform worthwhile projects and our district board work hard to ensure that we positively propel Altrusa and District Four in the right direction. Linda became an Altrusan in 1990. She has served as Club President twice, and all other board positions including Treasurer... but she's headed into that role this June. She calls herself an uncommon computer geek, in that she has lots of technical skills, but still strives to organize and lead community projects. Linda produces the annual club Yearbook, manages raffle tickets for the annual club fundraiser and publishes the Poetry Book for our annual Senior Citizens' Poetry Competition.

## Dolly Parton's Imagination Library is a book gifting program that mails free, high-quality books to children from birth to age five, no matter their family's income.

After launching in 1995, the program grew quickly. First books were only distributed to children living in Sevier County, Tennessee where Dolly grew up. It became such a success that in 2000 a national replication effort was underway. By 2003, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library had mailed one million books. It would prove to be the first of many millions of books sent to children around the world. Dolly's home state of Tennessee pledged to pursue statewide coverage in 2004 and global expansion was on the horizon. After the <u>United States</u>, the program launched in <u>Canada</u> in 2006 followed by the <u>United Kingdom</u> in 2007, Australia in 2013 and the <u>Republic of</u> <u>Ireland</u> in 2019.






## **Conference Workshops**

## ASTRA Service Award

The ASTRA Club Service Award has been established by Altrusa International and sponsored by Altrusa International Foundation to encourage ASTRA Clubs to actively participate in service projects designed to meet specific needs in the local community or within their own school community. This award is an opportunity for Altrusa International to recognize outstanding ASTRA Clubs for their achievements in service.

#### **District and International Competition**

Service projects nominated for the ASTRA Service Award are judged each year at District Conferences. First-place winners from each District are entered in the competition at the International Level. Established judging criteria are used by Districts and by International. Projects will be assessed by impartial judges based on their merits and results. One (1) service project from Clubs-At-Large may be included in the competition at the International level. This service project selection will be organized and overseen by the International ASTRA Committee.

#### Eligibility

Every ASTRA Club is eligible to enter one (1) service project each year. Projects that are primarily fundraising projects are not eligible. Also, a project submitted for an ASTRA Service Award may not also be submitted for the Mamie L. Bass Service Award or any other Altrusa award.

## **Judy Atkinson President's Award**

#### Eligibility

Clubs in District Four may submit a JAPA application. Three (3) copies must be submitted to the Immediate Past Governor, Chairman of the JAPA Awards Committee, post marked no later than **February 14th**. No President may win two (2) consecutive years.
